

Part time Anglophone Human Science Teacher

Context

The European School Lille Métropole opened its doors on September 2, 2019. It is located at 91 Avenue du Dr. Calmette in Marcq-en-Baroeul in the Lille Metropolitan Area.

Accredited "type II" European schools are established in the Member States of the European Union. They offer multilingual and multicultural education to children in nursery, primary and secondary cycles. At the end of a specific course, they deliver the European Baccalaureate diploma. Their pedagogical and educational setting complies with the requirements of the Board of Governors of the European Schools and the courses provided follow the programs of the European Schools. The European baccalaureate is recognized in all higher education institutions in the European community. Students follow classes in the section that corresponds to their dominant language: French or English.

At the start of the 2021 academic year, 8 levels will be open in each section (French and English): M1 (4 years old) and M2 (5 years old) for early childhood, P1 (6 years old), P2 (7 years old) and P3 (8 years old) in primary, S1 (11 years old), S2 (12 years old) and S3 (13 years old) in secondary. Then, an additional level will be opened each year to cover education from nursery 1 to grade S7.

A chance to join an exciting new project in the early days of its life and to progress with the school as it grows and develops:

- Temporary buildings evolving for two years.
- Continuous growth of the school for five years (constant reorganization of premises and functioning)
- Special requirements of the public: You will be part of a rich cultural blend of students and families
- As a French-hosted EU school, you will have the opportunity to experience several different educational influences (school management, National French Inspectorate, Inspection of European Schools).

Job specifics

Main missions

In the secondary cycle, students follow three weekly periods of human science (history and geography) as well as two weekly periods of non-confessional ethics. Each teaching period lasts 45 minutes. The successful candidate will provide an equivalent of 9 weekly hours of human science and non-confessional ethics, mainly in the Anglophone section (English-speaking and bilingual students).

The candidate will have to adopt the professional gestures specific to European schools:

- Include the European dimension in the teaching program.
- Build and communicate the annual teaching plans.
- Participate in the harmonization policy, in particular the evaluation policy.
- Participate in the support of pupils with difficulties, including in the primary cycle.
- Ensure effective communication with families, in particular providing a weekly parent meeting period.
- Participate in the quality assurance policy, in particular through workshops, inspections by directors, class visits and cross-observations.

- Build an annual educational development plan including specific training objectives, methods and actions. These training courses can take place in the school, the school district, a national setting or abroad.
- Get involved in the various educational actions between sections and educational cycles.
- Carry out cultural exchange projects with schools of the European Schools network.

Additional missions

- The successful candidate will work in collaboration with his / her Francophone human science colleague.
- The successful candidate may be called upon to act as a head teacher.
- Some additional periods of support or teacher replacement may be offered.

Requires skills and qualifications

- Higher education diploma in the subject area (history, geography, sociology, economy) and a teaching diploma for secondary education.
- Excellent teaching and pedagogical skills are required.
- Open-mindedness, the ability to communicate, flexibility and tolerance are essential.
- Ability to teach special needs students and to implement positive reinforcement strategies.
- A willingness and an ability to work in a team.
- A good command of the IT tool.
- The candidate must be able to communicate with the school community both in French and in English.
- The candidate must be able to teach in mixed classes where students have different levels of knowledge.
- The candidate must demonstrate a strong motivation to teach in a multicultural and multilingual environment.
- The candidate must demonstrate a spirit of collaboration with colleagues, management and families.
- A teaching experience in an international or bilingual school will be valued.

Contact and Procedure

The successful candidate will receive a one-year contract that can be renewed depending on job performance. The position will evolve to a full-time position in September 2022.
