

BACK TO SCHOOL 2022 : JOB DESCRIPTION

Primary Teachers working at the European School Lille Metropole – English Section.

CONTEXT

The European School of Lille type II, opened its doors on September 1, 2019.

- The European Schools and the type II European Schools are schools established in the Member States of the European Union. They offer multilingual and multicultural education to children in the nursery, primary and secondary cycles. Upon successful completion of the European Curriculum, students receive the European Baccalaureate diploma. The diploma's pedagogical and educational function complies with the requirements of the Superior Council of the European Schools and the courses follow the European school program. The curriculum allows students to obtain the European Baccalaureate, a diploma recognized in all higher education establishments in the European community.
- Beyond linguistic practices, the choice of subjects is very open, giving rise to diverse courses. These schools must allow the sharing of European values and cultural openness.
- On September 1, 2021, 10 year levels will be open for each of the sections (French and English): M1(4 years old) and M2 (5 years old) for Early Education, P1 (CP), P2 (CE1), P3 (CE2) and P4 (CM1) in primary, S1 (6ème), S2 (5ème), S3 (4ème) and S4 (3ème) in college. Then an additional level will be opened each year to cover teaching from nursery to 12th grade.
- The European School is located in Marcq en Baroeul, 91 avenue du Docteur Calmette.

The candidate should be prepared to adapt to challenging working conditions :

- Before moving within 2 years to the future premises of the school (which will include modern architecture, and will be spacious and eco-labeled) the candidate will participate in the exciting development of a school mission. This will include the necessary stage of adapting to provisional workspaces. The school mission is geared towards Europe, sustainable development and the richness of multiculturalism which is already demonstrated by the more than 35 different nationalities represented in the student body and their families, who are integral and active parts of the school's functioning.
- In order to progress as a teacher along with this ambitious school project, the candidate will be assisted with three levels of educational oversight (school management, French Inspection, Inspection of European Schools).

MISSIONS

The candidate must adopt the professional gestures specific to European schools:

- Include the European dimension in the teaching program
- Communicate annual and weekly teaching plans
- Participate in the harmonization of school policy, in particular during weekly staff meetings
- Participate in the support and accompaniment of students experiencing difficulty, including in the secondary cycle
- Ensure effective communication with families, including weekly parent meetings
- Participate in the quality assurance policy, in particular through inspections by directors, class visits and interclass observations

The candidate will have to establish an annual educational development plan including the objectives, methods and actions of training.

SKILLS REQUIRED

- Given the nature courses to be taught, the candidate must be a native English speaker (level C2).
- Excellent pedagogical and educational skills is required.
- Open-mindedness, communication skills, flexibility and tolerance are essential: the candidate must demonstrate a strong motivation to teach in a multicultural and multilingual environment.
- Great adaptability and high availability.
- A willingness and ability to work in a team: the candidate must show a spirit of collaboration with colleagues, management and families.
- A good command of technology is necessary.
- The candidate must be able to communicate in the two languages of the school (English and French).
- The candidate should be able to teach in mixed classes with students having different levels of knowledge (i.e. students from different school systems).
- International teaching experience is valued.
